

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

### CERTIFYNOW 2021

#### What is NYSCRA's new online testing program?

- CertifyNow is NYSCRA's newly designed (appointment-based) testing program for the Realtime Certified Reporter (RCR) exam. Beginning Spring 2021, testing will be available to prospective test-takers on weekends throughout the calendar year. Holidays and other certain dates are excluded.
- 2. Assigned proctors administer pre-recorded video dictation via Zoom by screen-sharing.

#### How do I register and schedule a test?

- 1. When the program is launched, prospective test-takers can log on to https://www.nyscra.org/upcoming-tests to register and provide date preferences.
- 2. An automatic confirmation will be sent. Your preference dates will be shared with available proctors. Once matched, your proctor will connect with you directly by email or phone.

#### What are the costs and cancellation policy?

- New tiered (discounted) fee structure is designed to encourage successive testing opportunities in one calendar (base) year: first test \$150; \$120 for second; \$95 for third and beyond.
- Due to the frequent scheduling of the *CertifyNow* program, refunds will only be considered in the event of unforeseen circumstances and then less \$35 administrative fee. Prospective testers are encouraged not to book appointments unless confident the date and time is feasible.

#### What are the technical requirements for testing online?

- 1. Strong internet connection.
- 2. Web cam to communicate with your proctor via Zoom, reliable internet, knowing how to create a PDF and upload to nyscra.org/certifynow website.
- 3. Headphones are optional.
- 4. It is the test-taker's responsibility to be prepared on test day. Proctors will not provide Zoom or CAT procedural instructions.

#### What are the RCR test specifications?

- 1. A two-minute warm-up is played, followed by five minutes each of deposition and court testimony at 200 WPM.
- 2. The format is three voices: questioning attorney and witness. The third voice in the deposition dictation is the objecting attorney in colloquy. The third voice in the court dictation is the court in colloquy.
- 3. Translation files are submitted in PDF format by uploading to nyscra.org/certifynow. Review how to submit a test file using the screen-sharing feature by clicking <u>here</u>.
- 4. Writing in all caps is optional.
- 5. Only double-spaced tests will be graded.
- 6. Only one translation file is created and submitted that will contain the warm-up and two tests. Files are not closed and reopened after warm-up or deposition or court testimony.
- 7. Files are named using your identification number provided by the assigned proctor followed by the name of the test and date. Detailed instructions are provided after registration.
- 8. Both tests are automatically graded unless declared by test-taker as *not transcribed*.
- 9. Only one passing grade is required to become certified.
- 10. 40 errors maximum are allowed for passing grade.
- 11. Grade notifications are emailed usually within two weeks from your test date.
- 12. You will not lose points with or without the "BY" line following colloquy.
- 13. Word lists and speaker name designations will be provided by assigned proctors.

#### What are the prerequisites to testing?

- 1. Members and non-members may take NYSCRA exam but membership in good standing is required to use credentials.
- 2. Maintaining credentials requires being a member in good standing.
- 3. Credentials are *evergreen*, i.e., remain valid with membership in good standing.
